## **Providing Hope to Homeless Pets**

As a lifelong animal advocate, I never dreamed I would have the opportunity to start a nonprofit whose mission is saving the lives of homeless dogs and cats in our community! It all started one night in 2009 after watching a heart-wrenching commercial that depicted mistreated dogs and cats. I searched for my remote control to quickly change the channel. Like most of us, we do not want to see the suffering. At that moment, I realized I could not turn a blind eye on animal suffering any longer and I asked myself the question, what can I do?

That simple question gave birth to an event that has turned into an annual fundraiser with the fun and whimsical name, The Bow Wow Luau & the Cat's Meow\*. Since our founding, this annual event has donated over \$70,000 to save the lives of countless formerly homeless dogs and cats.

Not all dogs and cats have a home, but we wish they did. Sadly, every day over 950 healthy and adoptable dogs and cats are killed in shelters throughout the U.S. because they do not have a home. Tragically, North Carolina ranks #3 in the nation for euthanasia due to pet overpopulation. In 2022, 30,848 dogs and cats were killed in animal shelters across North Carolina. Each was a life worth saving.

Many people ask how our charity, Heidi's Hope for Homeless Animals, got its name. Heidi was my beloved dog for over 17 years and her legacy lives on through our work in helping animals in need. Today, I'm blessed with a new companion, my Cocker Spaniel rescue Cooper, who serves as the Chief Canine Officer (CCO) of Heidi's Hope for Homeless Animals.

When he is not working on our many pet food drives, Cooper loves the beach and we enjoy kayaking in the Intracoastal Waterway. Cooper is proud to be the CCO and he welcomes being a voice for the voiceless for his fellow dogs and cats in need of good homes.

In 2019, to commemorate the 50th anniversary of Woodstock, we partnered with Coastal Kia to host a pet adoption event that we named WoofStock. Many dogs and cats who had spent months in shelters were adopted and given a new lease on life!

When disaster strikes, our amazing Wilmington community rallies together to help animals in desperate need, whether it is our furry neighbors in our community or internationally. The 2017-2019 hurricane season left pets

stranded in the aftermath. Each of these years, we led community-wide pet donation drives that filled three tractor trailers with pet food that we sent to feed pets impacted by Hurricanes Irma, Florence and Dorian. We also sent 85 crates to Puerto Rico to transport stranded animals from Hurricane Irma and recently shipped five pallets of pet food to help pets in Ukraine.

Many older adults on fixed incomes share their food with their pets because they cannot afford both. In 2018, we partnered with the New Hanover County Department of Senior Services to launch Heidi's Hope for Homeless Animals' Pet Meals On Wheels to regularly deliver pet food to housebound older adults.

Our Pet Food Bank began as a one-time event that uncovered a void in the community where people who were facing economic hardship are struggling to put food on their own tables and in their pet's bowl. We created the first Pet Food Bank in the Cape Fear Region to help feed hungry pets. To feed the pets of the most vulnerable in our community, we created a coalition of partnerships to distribute pet food to owners with the greatest needs: those on government assistance programs and older adults on fixed incomes.

Two years ago, our charity received a generous donation from a lady in Nova Scotia. She selected our animal nonprofit because of our Gold Standard Charity designation and its lifesaving impact. Thanks to her donation, we secured a tractor trailer with 32,302 pounds of pet food from Chewy and expanded our coalition to over 20 community partners. We are working to get another tractor trailer of pet food to continue expanding our partnerships to feed hungry pets.

We have many upcoming FUN-raisers: BARKtoberfest with Carolina Ale House on South College Road; HOWL-O-Ween Pet Photos at Woof Gang Bakery & Grooming in Lumina Commons; our annual Pet Photos with The Grinch in November and many more pawsome events to help our furry friends.

When I think back of that night in 2009, answering that simple question, what can I do, has saved the lives of countless dogs and cats and has helped fill pets' bowls with food and hope. I look forward to our next chapter and continue to be dedicated to working towards a time when there are no more homeless or hungry pets in our community. Amazing results happen when we work together toward our mutual goal: a time when all dogs and cats have good homes with loving families.

My first night home after being adopted by my new Mom, I was nervous, and I watched her hands at all times. My Mom detected that I was intently watching her hands and realized that hand-shy may be a sign of previous abuse. She tested me by raising her hand to me, and I cowered and went into self-defense mode. My Mom had tears streaming down her face and realized that she feared—that I had been abused. At that moment, she swore that she would never let anything harm me again. That was the first level of trust.

When my Mom adopted me, I was underweight (since then, I have many treats and may have gain a pound or two...or more!). My Mom got me toys and rolled a ball right past me—I just stared at it. Sadly, the only toys I had previously were an empty paper towel roll and empty water bottles. Since then, I've learned to play and have many toys that I love to play with!

Like many rescue pets, I had a some behavioral issues to overcome because of my past. It did not happen overnight, but with patience, training, time and treats (*my favorite!!*), after a couple of months, we had a breakthrough! Then, another, and another, and like peeling back the layers of an onion, each layer revealed a new layer of trust and bonding.

We enrolled in training, then advanced training and I excelled in all of my training! Along with the training, were many treats. "Will work for treats is my motto!". I am very proud to report that I became a certified therapy dog!! Who says you can't teach a rescue dog new tricks? I'm



# My Five Year Gotcha Day!

Five years ago my adoption ad read, "Will be euthanized if not adopted soon...time running out...". Thankfully, at that same time, my new Mom, was searching to adopt a dog who would otherwise be unadopted. When she saw my ad, she knew that she needed to find me and adopt me! Five years ago, my previous owners packed up all my belongings and drove me to meet my new Mom. I was terrified since, like many rescue dogs, I had been bounced around from home to home, and worst of all, had been abused and neglected. I was labeled as "aggressive" but in reality, my behaviors were self-defense when being abused.

When my Mom met me, I could not even look at her—I had been incredibly let down by humans that I couldn't trust anyone.

I have been given a new lease on life and I wish that for all of my fellow dogs and cats who are awaiting a good home with forever families!


